TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. This competition is organised by The National Centre for Learning Welsh.
- 2. This competition is open to people who are learning Welsh with The National Centre for Learning Welsh and its course providers or with other providers.
- Applicants must write a Welsh-language story on the theme 'The Book'. The story must be original and unpublished. There is a category for each level of learning: Mynediad (Entry), Sylfaen (Foundation), Canolradd (Intermediate) and Uwch (Advanced).
- 4. Entries must be submitted via an online application form only. Applicants will receive an automatic message acknowledging receipt of the application.
- 5. Entries should not include defamatory, indecent, offensive or any other unsuitable content. The applications should be suitable for online publication by the Centre.
- 6. Applicants retain the copyright of their applications but grant the Centre a nonexclusive, royalty-free license in perpetuity to publish online and share the application on any platforms.
- 7. By submitting a story, the applicant agrees that the Centre may, at its own discretion, modify, shorten or translate the application.
- 8. The stories will be judged by two Welsh-language authors. There will be a winner in each category and publicity for the winners.
- 9. The winning stories will be published online during 'Amdani' The Learn Welsh Festival of Reading (Gŵyl Ddarllen Dysgu Cymraeg), 28 February 4 March 2022.
- 10. The Centre's decision is final.
- 11. The Centre retains the right to disqualify any application in breach of any of these Terms and Conditions or to withhold an award if it is of the opinion that an application does not meet the required standard.
- 12. The Centre retains the right to amend these Terms and Conditions or to cancel the competition at any time if deemed necessary or if circumstances beyond its control arise.
